- Primary Service Area: STI/HIV
- Patient Population: Evenly split insurance statuses
- Number of Patients Served: About 3,050 including HIV, STI, PrEP, and Gender Care patients between September 2019 – August 2020. Up to 1,367 of these patients were served via TeleKind.
