



Communicating COVID: ECHO for Community Health Workers

The COVID-19 pandemic created unprecedented challenges for the public health workforce and the communities it serves. Workforce shortages, misinformation, and eroding trust between the public and the health workforce has highlighted the critical need for a community-partnership, resource-sharing, and mutual support.

To address this, **Health Confianza is hosting a free series, Communicating COVID: ECHO for Community Health Workers.** Health Confianza is a partnered initiative between UT Health San Antonio, UT San Antonio, and the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District to share information about COVID-19 with Community Health Workers. ECHO Sessions will be hosted by a team of experts in community health, health literacy, and infectious disease. Each session will include didactics followed by participant presentations of real-life situations and group discussion to share resources and inform care.
