


TODAY I WILL SEE A NEW PATIENT NAMED OZZIE. MY ASSOCIATE WILL SEE HIS SISTER, HARRIET. THEY BOTH HAVE AUTISM.



OZZIE AND HARRIET ARRIVE A FEW MINUTES LATE. HARRIET DID NOT EXPECT THE CHANGE HER IN ROUTINE AND HAD A MELTDOWN DURING THE RIDE TO THE OFFICE.



MY COLLEAGUE AND I PUT ON OUR PPE. WE DO NOT HEAR ANY NOISE FROM THE WAITING ROOM. WE are relieved. WE are ready to see ozzie and harriet.



OZZIE IS FIRST. HE BECOMES ABITATED WHEN HE HEARS HIS NAME. HE DOES NOT WANT TO ENTER THE TREATMENT AREA. I THINK "I AM NOT TRAINED TO TREAT PATIENTS WITH AUTISM". I BEBIN TO FILL OUT THE REFERRAL FORM.




WHEN I RETURN WITH THE REFERRAL, I SEE MY ASSISTANT SITTING ON THE FLOOR WITH OZZIE. HE IS CALM AS SHE EXPLAINS EACH STEP TO HIS TREATMENT. SHE LETS HIM KNOW THAT TO EARN A PRIZE, HE MUST DO EACH STEP - OZZIE DECIDES TO COME IN.



OZZIE SAT ON THE BUEST CHAIR AND OPENED HIS MOUTH. I THOUBHT I'D JUST TRY TO BET A QUICK PEEK, BUT HE LET ME DO A COMPLETE EXAM AND EVEN ALLOWED FOR AN XRAY! AFTER A BREAK, HE LET ME REMOVE THE CALCULUS AROUND HIS SORE TOOTH!







Meanwhile, Harriet has been waiting in the next room. My associate asks harriet which color toothbrush she wants her to use. Harriet chooses purple.



JUST AS MY ASSOCIATE BEGINS, HARRIET SUDDENLY BECOMES VERY UPSET. SHE SQUIRMS AND CRIES UNCONTROLLABLY. HARRIET'S MOTHER TAKES HER TO THE BATHROOM FOR A BREAK.








WHEN HARRIET COMES OUT OF THE BATHROOM, SHE IS HAPPY. YOU DON'T WANT TO UPSET HER AGAIN, SO YOU DECIDE TO REFER HER FOR SEDATION BUT...



Harriett Happily returns to the operatory on her own...






... HOPS LIGHT INTO THE CHAIL AND OPENS HEL MOUTH...SHE IS A BLEAT PATIENT! YOU THINK, treating someone with autism is not that different from treating anyone else.



TODAY I SAW A PATIENT NAMED OZZIE. MY ASSOCIATE SAW HIS SISTER, HARRIET. THEY BOTH HAVE AUTISM. WE CAN'T WAIT TO SEE THEM IN 6 MONTHS.



Take Home Goodles

Those who have Autism face challenges with communication, behavior, and restrictiveness.

Predictable routines help people who have Autism to better cope with their environment.

Visual aids can help to outline the steps to the procedure, the expectations, and the endpoint

Dental Goodies

Treatment does not have to be done in the dental chair.

Breaks not only help the patient but also, the providers.

Only give positive reinforcement for met expectations.

Tailor approach for each patient.

Remember that behavior is a form of communication.

Dental findings are generally related to maladaptive behaviors and restrictiveness.

CASE 1

Patient Introduction

Age: 7 year old currently (at time of evaluation was 3 years old)

Gender: female

Chief compliant: Is here for evaluation of cavities. Second opinion.

Review of medical & dental history

MEDICAL

- ASA 2
 - Autistic
 - Eczema
- Meds
 - Steroid cream
- Other:
 - Hx of occupational therapy
 - Speech therapy

DENTAL

- Visit on Oct/2019 for evaluation
 - Was told patient had 2 cavities
 - Knee to knee exam completed and able to use explorer; used bubbles as distraction







Dental Recall Exam



3 years old at this visit on 7/2020

- FINDINGS: tooth C (facial) cavitation is beginning, tooth H (facial) cavitation is beginning, tooth B (occlusal) stick

Treatment recommended: SDF application to C and H. Tooth B- interim therapeutic restoration using glass ionomer; knee to knee and no use of papoose

**Able to maintain from caries progression Tooth B,C and H.





Recare...


- Recall appt after dental rehab was 5/2022 (patient is now 5 years old)
 - Now is talkative, sat in chair and allowed exam and toothbrush prophy
 - DID NOT LIKE FLUORIDE
 - Restorations intact
- Recall appt 12/2022 (patient is now 6 years old)
 - Restorations intact
 - Behavior is better; sat in dental chair; allowed the use of suction





Recare...

- Recall appt 8/2023
 - More talkative, inquisitive (asking lots of questions); is now reading!
 - Allowed x-rays (1st time in clinic)- 2bw's taken
 - Incipient lesion on #19(buccal), informed mother and monitoring.

CASE 2

Patient Introduction

Age: 7 year old currently (at time of initial exam was 5 years old)

Gender: male

Chief compliant: Patient was to have FMDR under general anesthesia and was unable to have treatment completed due to finances.



Review of medical & dental history

MEDICAL

- ASA 2
 - Autistic: speech delay and diagnosed at age 3
- Meds
 - none
- Other:
 - Speech therapy

DENTAL

- Visit on 2/2022 for initial evaluation
 - Treatment alternative was SDF of teeth: J,K
 - OBTAINED x-rays
- Recall visit on 9/2022
 - Patient sat in chair, on his left side but reluctant
 - Unable to get x-rays






Note on Behavior

Patient screaming and crying when brought back from lobby. Patient refused to sit and chair and exhibited combative behavior. Patient walked into OR chief room while provider was talking to mother. Patient allowed Dr. Shin to do oral evaluation while standing. With Dr. Shin's assistant was able to get x-rays. Mother states this is the first time patient allowed x-rays. Using a lot of TSD Dr. Y Perez performed prophylaxis but patient would not allow toothpaste in his mouth. Mother states patient has an oral aversion and hates toothpaste. The patient loves dinosaurs and has a green T-rex that he brought to the appointment.




Recare...

- Recall on 3/2023
 - Unable to take x-rays; arrested caries on the teeth that SDF was applied to and found new incipient lesions
- Recall on 9/2023
 - After 2 popsicles obtained INTRAORAL photos; patient was standing and watching the screen as photos taken



Intraoral Photos: 9/12/2023







Treatment under Sedation

Completed in-office sedation (dental school setting)

- tooth L had a stainless steel placed
- tooth K (occ) resin placed
- SDF was effective on tooth J (no tx at this time)

Review of medical & dental history

MEDICAL

- ASA 2
 - Autistic: unknown level
 - On target for
- Meds
 - none
- Other:
 - Speech therapy, PT (also for pelvic PTdue to holding urination), evaluating GI

DENTAL


- Visit on 2/2024 for initial evaluation/ another opinion
 - On abx; abscess present tooth B
 - Options presented
 - Elected papoose/nitrous/extraction of B & popsicle
 - Also got intraoral pics/ some xrays
- Comprehensive exam on 3/2024
 - Patient sat in chair, on top of papoose and wrapped herself
 - Able to get x-rays








