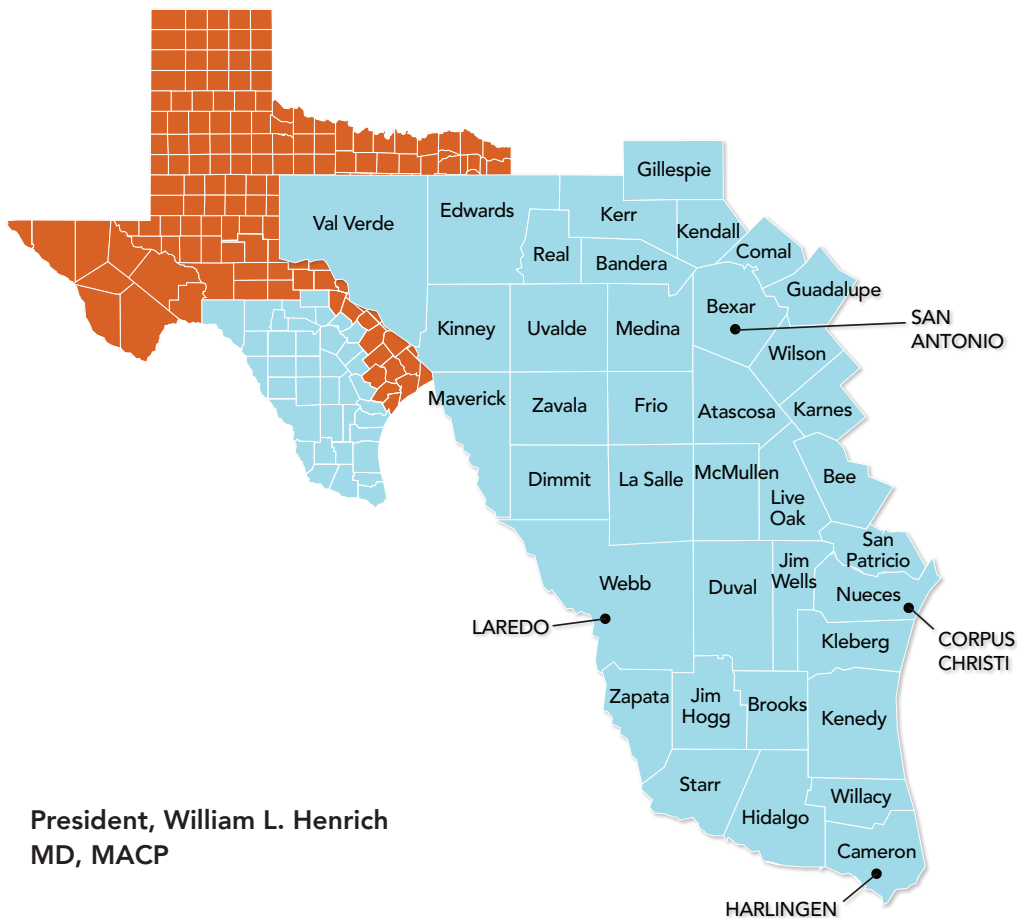

Leading Brain Health Research & Clinical Programs

UT Health San Antonio is on a remarkable trajectory of growth in addressing brain and behavioral health and that takes research, diagnosis, treatment, and prevention of brain disease to new levels. UT Health San Antonio ranks nationally in Brain and Neuroscience related research and clinical programs.

As 1 of 33 national and Texas' only Alzheimer's Disease Research Center (ADRC) designated by the National Institute on Aging (NIA), UT Health San Antonio is uniquely positioned to lead and transform brain and behavioral health through our institutes, programs, faculty, and students at the:

- The Biggs Institute for Alzheimer's and Neurodegenerative Diseases (Only ADRC in Texas and 1 of 33 nationally).
- The Barshop Institute for Longevity and Aging Studies
- Center for Biomedical Neuroscience
- STRONG STAR Consortium for PTSD Research
- School of Nursing opioid overdose prevention program "moreNARCANplease"
- The Child Psychiatry Access Network (CPAN) and Texas Child Health Access Through Telemedicine (TCHAT) psychiatric medication management and behavioral health therapy services for children
- Be Well, Texas Program, a no-cost, 24/7 online access to anyone in the country with a substance use disorder
- Long COVID research

As evidenced by the ongoing research programs and uniquely obtained designations, UT Health San Antonio leads San Antonio and South Texas in providing our region with world class education, healthcare and research to lead as the primary driver of our \$44.1B economic impact in healthcare and bioscience sector.

UT Health San Antonio is making high-impact, innovative research to improve diagnosis, treatment, and prevention of brain diseases. UT Health San Antonio will continue to make strides in aging, Alzheimer's, behavioral and mental health, long COVID, neurodegenerative, neurological, psychiatric, and posttraumatic stress disorders that impact all our lives in some way. The coordination between our translational research and clinical care are advancing patient outcomes. As we continue to make advances in areas, such as researching the causes and neurological treatments for Long COVID, resources to enhance brain health-related research and treatment are vital.
